- **a.** If you have an OT license that expires June 30, 2020, for the renewal period ending in June 30, 2020 ONLY, the Board will be allowing all OT Practitioners to renew based on the CCA you have completed. You must still renew on time and must still enter all your CCA data into the Board's web-based site, there is no exception to this. Any CCA not completed, including ethics, that is necessary for your June 30, 2020 renewal will be required for your June 30, 2021 renewal in addition to your regular required CCA for your 2021 renewal
- **b.** The decision to see client is a decision each Practitioner and the business must make.
- **c.** The Board is concerned about COVID-19 and its effect on OT Practitioners and the public. However, the Board does not have legal authority to tell OT Practitioners they cannot work or to tell employers to close their businesses.
